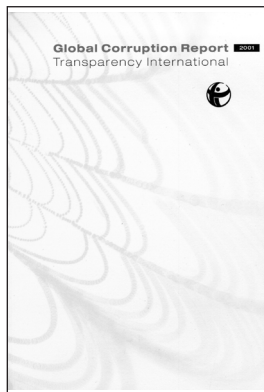




Global Corruption Report 2003

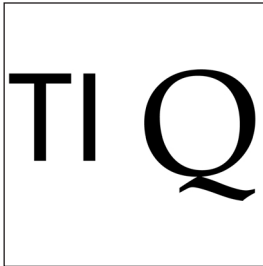
